Introduction

H Series, an ultra-high lumen density COB product line, is designed for high intensity spot lights used in commercial and retail settings. H series arrays offer industry leading color over angle uniformity, and replace ceramic metal halide lamps by providing equal or greater center beam candle power at lower power and at greater lifetimes. Their tight beam control and exceptional quality of light is well suited for demanding directional spot applications.

H Series LEDs are available in a variety of CCT and CRI combinations, including Class A—a revolutionary advancement in lighting designed to match how humans perceive and prefer light. Typical applications for H Series LEDs include, but are not limited to, commercial and residential down lights, accent, spot & track-lights.


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

Performance at Commonly Used Drive Currents


Figure 2: Drive Current vs. Voltage (T_i = T_c = 25°C)


Figure 3: Typical Relative Luminous Flux vs. Drive Current ($T_i = T_c = 25^{\circ}C$)

H Series LED arrays are tested to the specifications shown using the nominal drive currents in Table 1. H Series arrays may also be driven at other drive currents depending on specific application design requirements. The performance at any drive current can be derived from the efficacy vs. flux characteristics in Figure 1, the current vs. voltage characteristics shown in Figure 2 and the flux vs. current characteristics shown in Figure 3. The performance at commonly used drive currents is summarized in Table 3.



- 3. H15 LED arrays can be operated above LM-80 maximum drive current, up to 3500 mA. Contact Bridgelux for details.
- 4. Lumen maintenance (L70) and lifetime predictions are valid for drive current and case temperature conditions used for LM-80 testing as included in the applicable LM-80 test report for these arrays. Contact your Bridgelux sales representatives for LM-80 report.
- 5. Arrays may be driven at higher currents. However, lumen maintenance may be reduced. Contact Bridgelux for details.
- 6. Bridgelux recommends a maximum duty cycle of 10% and pulse width of 20 ms when operating LED Arrays at maximum peak pulsed current specified. Maximum peak pulsed currents indicate values where LED Arrays can be driven without catastrophic failures.
- 7. Light emitting diodes are not designed to be driven in reverse voltage and will not produce light under this condition. Maximum rating provided for reference only.
- 8. The working voltage designated for insulation is 150 V DC, according to safety testing per IEC 62031 standard.



Figure 5: Typical DC ccy Shift vs. Case Temperature





Figure 6: Typical DC ccx Shift vs. Case Temperature



Figure 7: Typical Spatial Radiation Pattern



Figure 8: Typical Color Spectrum



Figure 9: Drawing for H15 LED Array



Notes for Figure 11:

- 1. Each tube holds 25 H15 COB arrays.
- 2. One tube is sealed in an anti-static bag. Four such bags are placed in a box and shipped. Depending on quantities ordered, a bigger shipping box, containing four boxes will be used to ship products.
- 3. Each bag and box is to be labeled as shown above.
- 4. Dimensions for each tube are 21.3 (W) \times 9.5(H) \times 505 mm. Dimensions for the anti-static bag are 75 (W) \times 615 (L) \times 3.1 (T) mm and that of a shipping box are 58.7 \times 13.3 \times 7.9 cm.

Bridgelux COB arrays have laser markings on the back side of the substrate to help with product identification. In addition to the product identification markings, Bridgelux COB arrays also contain markings for internal Bridgelux manufacturing use only. The image below shows which markings are for customer use and which ones are for Bridgelux internal use only. The Bridgelux internal manufacturing markings are subject to change without notice, however these will not impact the form, function or performance of the COB array.

Please use appropriate precautions. It is important that employees working with LEDs are trained to use them safely.

CAUTION: RISK OF BURN

Do not touch the H Series LED array during operation. Allow the array to cool for a sufficient period of time before handling. The H Series LED array may reach elevated temperatures such that could burn skin when touched.

Optics and reflectors must not be mounted in contact with the LES (yellow phosphor resin area). Optical devices may be mounted on the top surface of the Bridgelux H Series LED Array except the optical area. Use the LED array edges to locate and secure optical devices as needed but do not apply large bending forces on the edges of the array.

Unless otherwise stated, array testing is performed at the nominal drive current.
