




Fig. 2. Normalized total power dissipation as a function of junction temperature

$$P_{der} = \frac{P_{tot}}{P_{tot(25^\circ\text{C})}} \times 100 \%$$




Fig. 3. Normalized continuous drain current as a function of junction temperature

$$I_{der} = \frac{I_D}{I_{D(25^\circ\text{C})}} \times 100 \%$$




Fig. 4. Safe operating area; junction to ambient; continuous and peak drain currents as a function of drain-source voltage




Fig. 5. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values




Fig. 6. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values




Fig. 7. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values




Fig. 8. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage




Fig. 9. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values





Fig. 10. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values

Fig. 11. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values






Fig. 12. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance as a function of junction temperature; typical values

$$a = \frac{R_{DSon}}{R_{DSon(25\text{ }^\circ\text{C})}}$$





Fig. 15. Gate-source voltage as a function of gate charge; typical values





Fig. 16. Gate charge waveform definitions




Fig. 18. Duty cycle definition




Fig. 19. Package outline TO-236AB (SOT23)




Fig. 20. Reflow soldering footprint for TO-236AB (SOT23)




Fig. 21. Wave soldering footprint for TO-236AB (SOT23)
