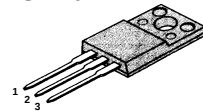

Fig 1. Output Characteristics

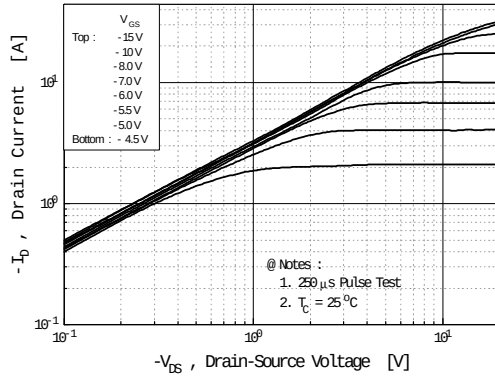


Fig 2. Transfer Characteristics

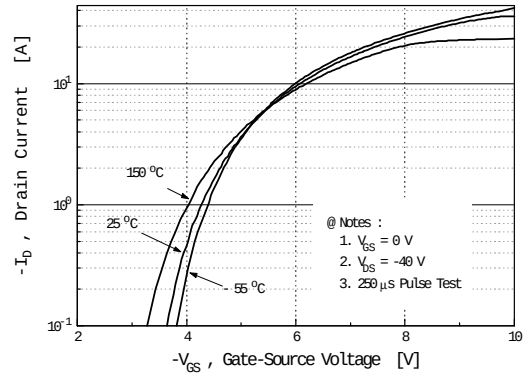


Fig 3. On-Resistance vs. Drain Current

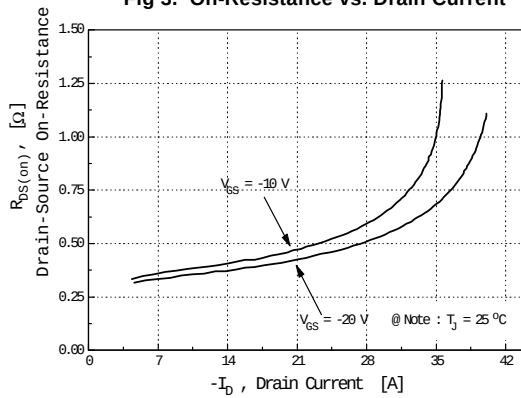


Fig 4. Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage

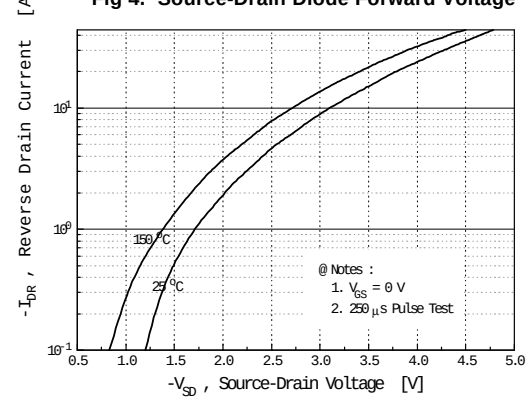


Fig 5. Capacitance vs. Drain-Source Voltage

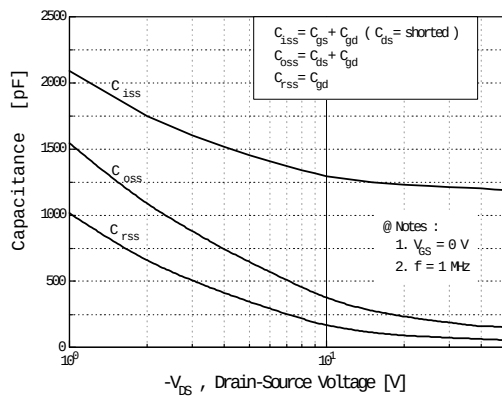


Fig 6. Gate Charge vs. Gate-Source Voltage

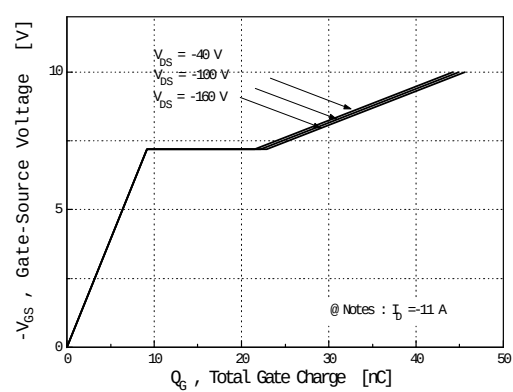


Fig 8. On-Resistance vs. Temperature

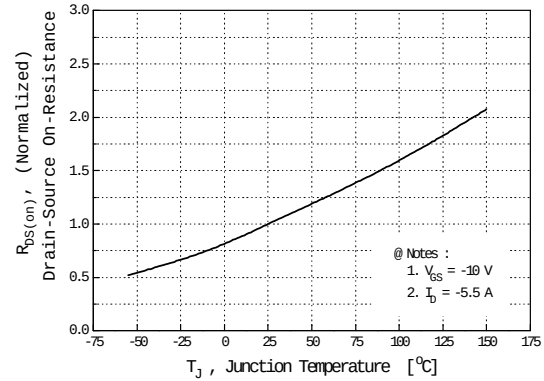
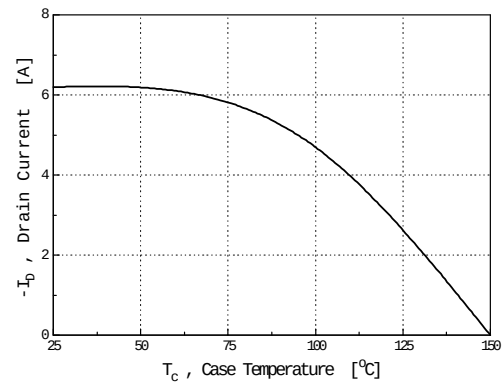


Fig 10. Max. Drain Current vs. Case Temperature

Fig 12. Gate Charge Test Circuit & Waveform

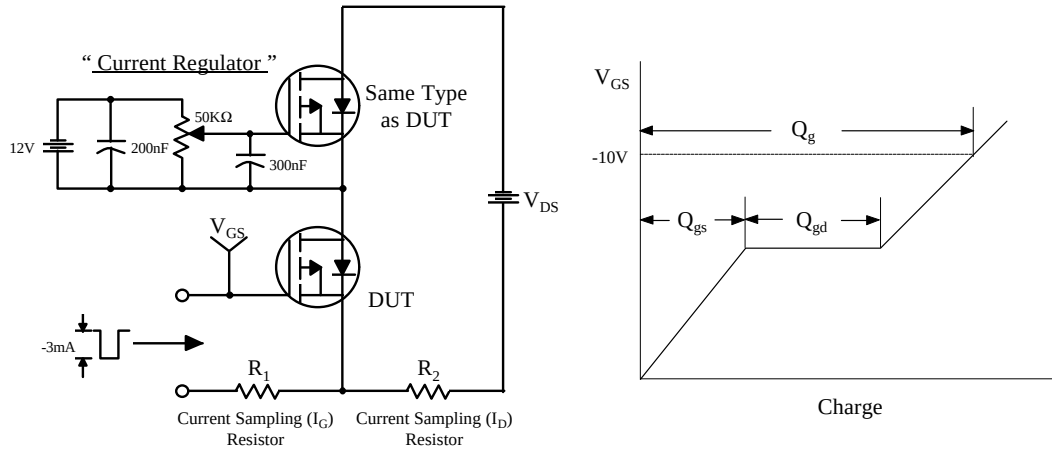


Fig 13. Resistive Switching Test Circuit & Waveforms

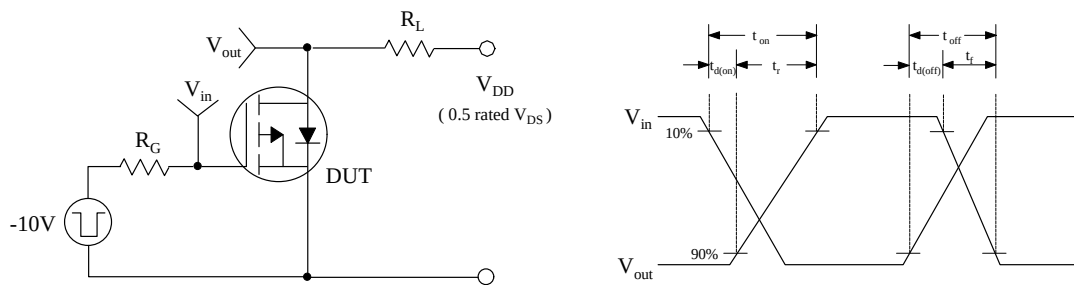


Fig 14. Unclamped Inductive Switching Test Circuit & Waveforms

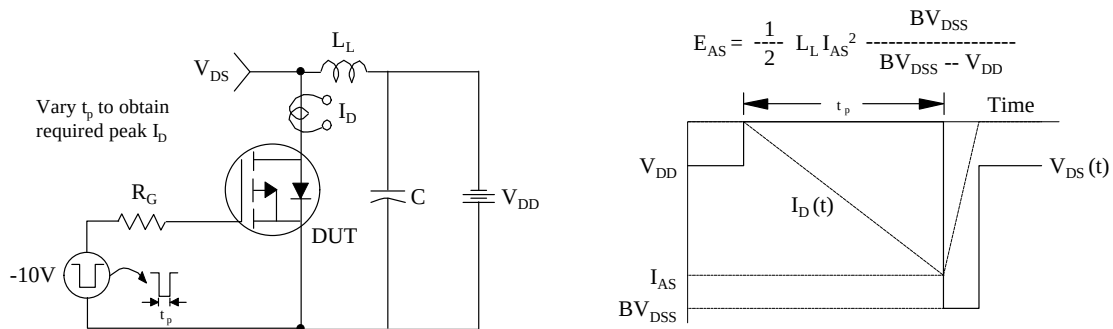
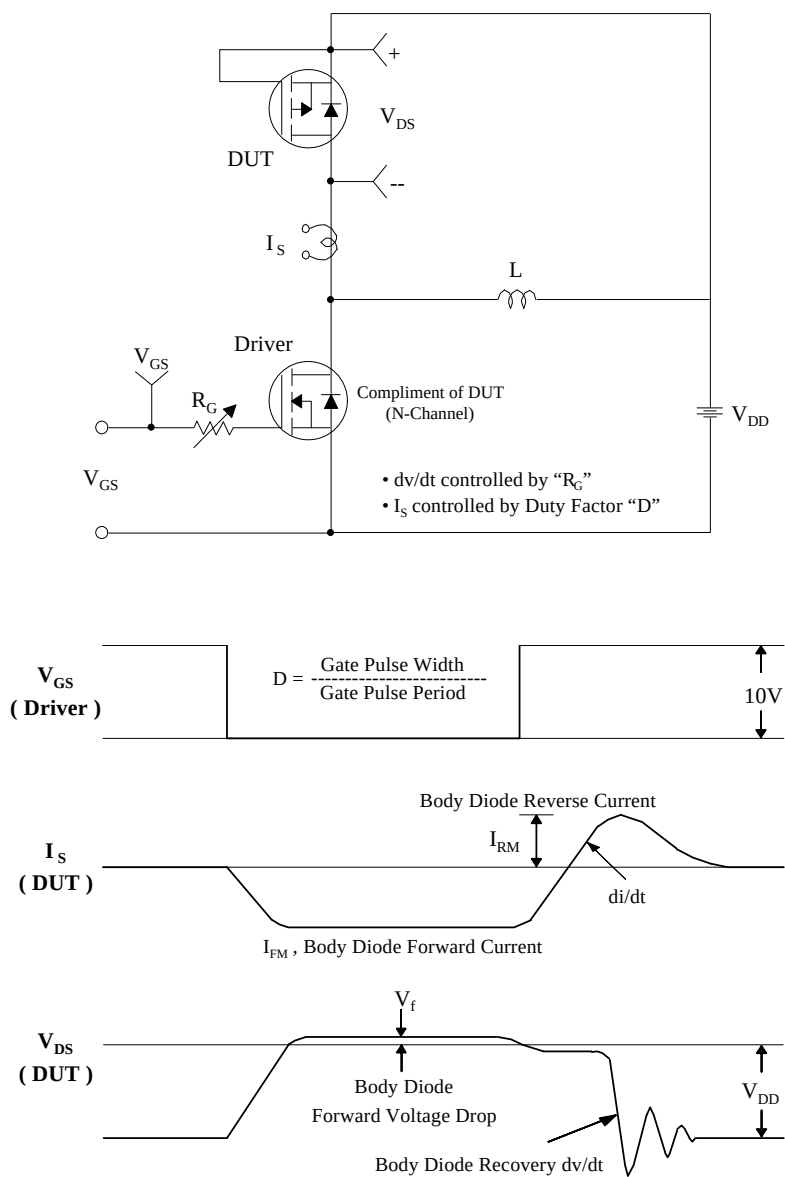


Fig 15. Peak Diode Recovery dv/dt Test Circuit & Waveforms



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
