

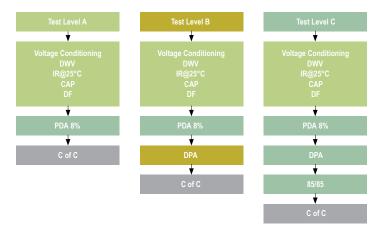
Commercial Off-the-Shelf (COTS) for Higher Reliability Applications, C0G Dielectric, 10VDC-200VDC

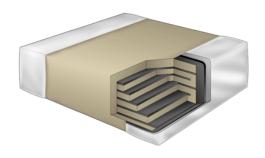
Overview

KEMET's COTS program is an extension of our capability and knowledge regarding high reliability test criteria and requirements. As an established and trusted supplier of "up-screened" products, the COTS program was developed in response to the growing demand within the defense, aerospace, automotive, medical and consumer electronics industries for lower cost and commercially available products that offers the same high quality and high reliability as upscreened products. The COTS program addresses this demand and integrates commercial grade products with high reliability testing and inspection protocols that provide the accelerated conditioning and 100% screening necessary to eliminate infant mortal failures from the population.

KEMET's COG dielectric features a 125°C maximum operating temperature and is considered "stable." The Electronics Components, Assemblies & Materials Association (EIA) characterizes COG dielectric as a Class I material. Components of this classification are temperature compensating and are suited for resonant circuit applications or those where Q and stability of capacitance characteristics are required. COG exhibits no change in capacitance with respect to time and voltage and boasts a negligible change in capacitance with reference to ambient temperature. Capacitance change is limited to ±30ppm/°C from -55°C to +125°C.

All COTS testing includes voltage conditioning and post-electrical testing as per MIL-PRF-55681. For enhanced reliability, KEMET offers the following test level options and conformance certifications:

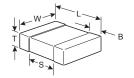

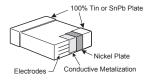

Note: When measuring capacitance it is important to ensure the set voltage level is held constant. The HP4284 & Agilent E4980 have a feature known as Automatic Level Control (ALC). The ALC feature should be switched to "ON".

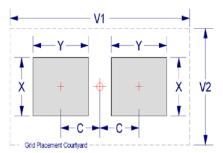

Storage and Handling

Ceramic chip capacitors should be stored in normal working environments. While the chips themselves are quite robust in other environments, solderability will be degraded by exposure to high temperatures, high humidity, corrosive atmospheres, and long term storage. In addition, packaging materials will be degraded by high temperature – reels may soften or warp, and tape peel force may increase. KEMET recommends that maximum storage temperature not exceed 40 degrees C, and maximum storage humidity not exceed 70% relative humidity. In addition, temperature fluctuations should be minimized to avoid condensation on the parts, and atmospheres should be free of chlorine and sulfur bearing compounds. For optimized solderability, chip stock should be used promptly, preferably within 1.5 years of receipt.



Tape & Reel Packaging Information

KEMET offers Multilayer Ceramic Chip Capacitors packaged in 8mm, 12mm and 16mm tape on 7" and 13" reels in accordance with EIA standard 481. This packaging system is compatible with all tape fed automatic pick and place systems. See Table 2 for details on reeling quantities for commercial chips.

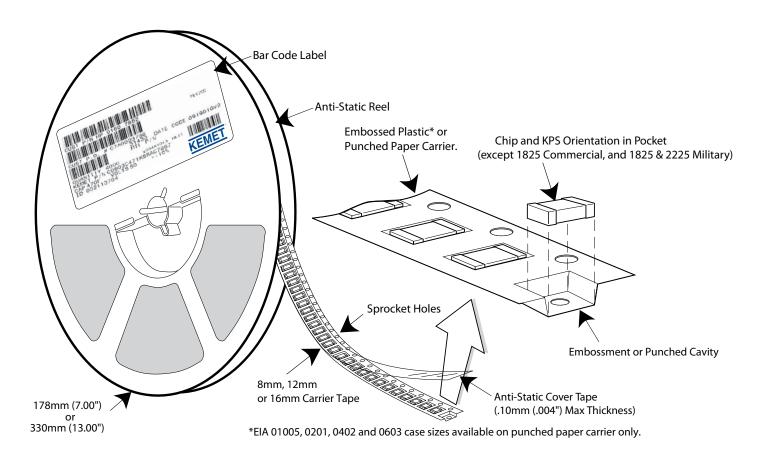

Figure 1 – Embossed (Plastic) Carrier Tape Dimensions

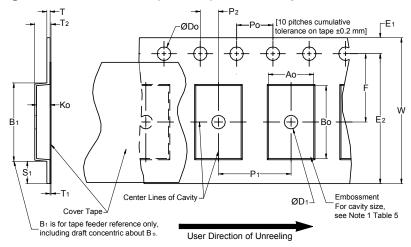

Figure 2 – Punched (Paper) Carrier Tape Dimensions

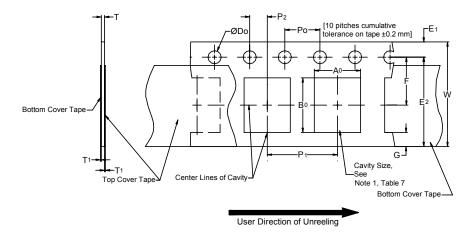

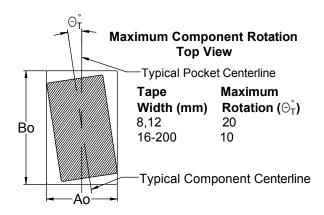

Figure 4 – Maximum Lateral Movement

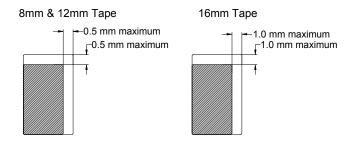


Figure 5 – Bending Radius

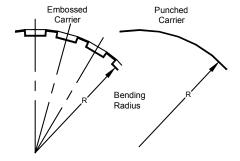
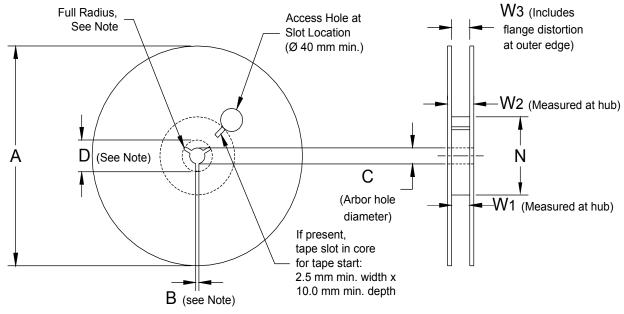




Figure 6 - Reel Dimensions

Figure 7 – Tape Leader & Trailer Dimensions

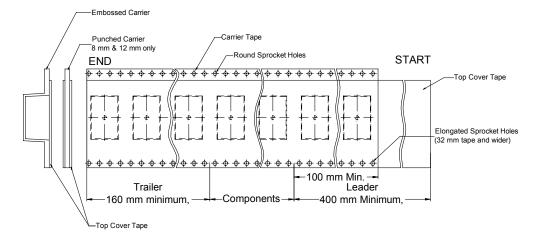


Figure 8 – Maximum Camber

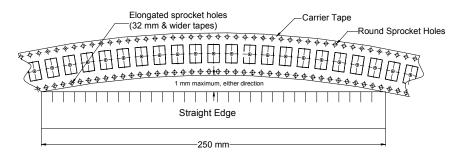




Figure 9 – Bulk Cassette Packaging (Ceramic Chips Only)

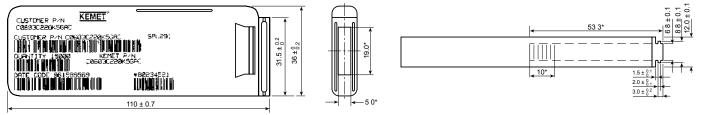
